Each year, local governments are taking on larger regulatory roles, passing legislation that has major impacts on businesses and communities.


Monitoring the extensive volume of proposed ordinances and discussions across dozens or even hundreds of bodies of local government is a task that cannot be effectively or accurately accomplished through an entirely manual process.

This is why public affairs professionals, business development leaders, and lobbyists are turning to local legislative tracking software to stay informed at a scale otherwise impossible.

What is Local Policy Monitoring Software?


Local policy monitoring software, such as <u>Curate</u>, is a vital tool for public affairs professionals that collects and analyzes public documents from municipal governments, automatically extracts relevant information, and provides users timely and custom alerts about relevant discussions and upcoming legislation.



How does it work?

Local policy monitoring software uses advanced data collection techniques to find public documents such as meeting minutes and agendas as soon as they are uploaded to the web and then analyzes the content of those documents to identify mentions associated with key topics.

Using machine learning algorithms, the software determines which mentions are relevant and sets aside the rest. Users then receive real-time alerts of these crucial insights for the specific topics they want to monitor. Users can also review all of their topics through an online dashboard.



What to expect from local policy monitoring software?

- Captures the entire text from meeting minutes and agendas posted online by city and county councils, committees, task forces, school boards, and other elected groups
- Extracts the most relevant information related to your key topics and delivers them in reports. It also lists them in a searchable, filterable feed on a customizable dashboard
- Allows you to do your own research in the database on historical documents
- Standardizes the documents in an easy-to-read and searchable format

Who uses it?

Corporations, industry associations, and nonprofit organizations of all sizes use local policy monitoring software to stay ahead of proposed ordinances, minimize risk, monitor their reputation, and capitalize on opportunities.

Unable to effectively monitor issues outside the largest metro areas, the public affairs team of a statewide hospitality association was getting blindsided by issues in smaller communities. Without adding headcount, the team is now catching more local policy issues with enough time to intervene, including in towns that would never be cost-effective to monitor manually.

How local policy monitoring software improves your government affairs strategy:

- **Spend less time on mindless tasks** like looking for documents and more time on higher-value activities like meeting with stakeholders who can move your initiatives forward, or launching grassroot advocacy campaigns. The software automatically collects all the relevant documents for you, so you can focus on taking action from the intelligence you gather.
- 2 Only review the documents that contain relevant mentions of your key issues. No more speed-reading through dozens of agendas just to find one that mentions an issue of concern or not find any relevant discussions at all.
- **3** Understand local issues in context. Best-in-class software lets you easily find the crucial information within the document, as well as see the entire text so you can fully understand the context of the issue.
- **Expand your tracking area to neighboring communities.** Local policies have a tendency to jump from one community to another. By tracking a larger area, you may be able to recognize policy trends before they show up on your local agenda and work to influence local attitudes proactively.
- Discover proposed legislation before it comes up for a vote or becomes law.

 Elected officials want to hear from the stakeholders who will be affected by proposed legislation, but they don't have time to reach out to the organizations it will impact.

 Government affairs teams have to keep up with local policies to gain the opportunity to make their voice heard.



Considerations for Selecting the Best Local Policy Monitoring Software

Before investing in local policy tracking software for the first time, it's helpful to think through the features and functionality to make sure you're able to get the most from the platform. Use these tips to evaluate the

different software options available.



Cost

Like most professional software tools, local policy monitoring software comes with a subscription fee. Most tools bill either monthly or annually. However, the fee is often small compared to the potential cost of missing a regulatory or policy change and significantly less than adding headcount to your team.



Users

The software doesn't replace government affairs teams, but it does help them be more efficient. Analysts still need to review alerts and identify action items, but they are able to do so at a speed, accuracy, and scale that is impossible with manual tracking. The tool you choose needs to accommodate the number of users who will access and integrate it with their existing legislative monitoring processes.

The pricing structure for local legislative tracking software often is tied to the number of accounts or users.



Locations to Monitor

The number of governing bodies that you need to keep track of will determine whether you need local policy monitoring software.

If your team only tracks one or two small municipalities, you may be able to keep up with what is happening in each of the commissions, committees, and other voting bodies in those two cities by manually finding agendas and minutes on the government websites and reading through them one by one.

But if you need to track more than three cities or across multiple counties, the massive amount of documents produced by those government bodies will likely be overwhelming if you don't have a tracking solution.

Adopting a local policy monitoring solution will ensure you never miss an issue.

Considerations



Population Size of the Smallest City You Need to Track

A local legislative tracking software won't add a lot of value if it is unable to track all the cities and counties your organization operates in. The number of locations and population of locations are two major distinguishing factors between the available local policy monitoring software options.

Software providers typically break down their coverage by population size, ranging from solutions that track cities as small as 2,000 residents to providers that only cover the 200 largest cities and counties within the 50 states.



Breadth of Data

Some legislative tracking solutions only collect information from cities with populations of 50,000 or more, while others collect data from cities as small as 2,000 residents. It's important to make sure the tool you are considering provides coverage of all the communities you need to monitor.

Filtering Options

Make sure the tracking technology you choose offers the ability to filter results within the dashboard in the same way your team divides up your coverage area or key policy issues. This way each team members can focus on the segments most important to them and won't waste time looking at legislative alerts that aren't of relevance.

This is especially important for government relations teams that work in highly populated areas. It's often not enough to be able to access local legislation updates at the county level because that still covers too large of an area.

Filters should give each user the ability to customize their own dashboard to maximize their productivity.

Tip: Look for software that lets you save multiple filters and share them with other users. It makes it easy to segment issues in different ways as responsibilities and initiatives change.



User-friendly **Format**

A key difference between many of the tracking solutions available comes from the user experience of reviewing the mention.

In some solutions, the software points the user to the government website where the agenda is stored and leaves the user to search through the document on their own, or even read it through from top to bottom if the agenda is not in a searchable format. Others provide a report in an excel-type document with minimal details.

The better user experience comes from the all-in-one solutions that import agendas and minutes into the software, presenting relevant mentions in an easy-to-read feed format and then linking to information in a full context of a searchable document.



Standardized, Readable, Searchable Documents

Name Recognition **Tracking**

In addition to using local legislative software to mitigate policy risk, many companies monitor the discussions happening in local government for reputation management purposes by including their own company name as an advocacy priority.

Similarly, they can also gain insight into their competitors by getting updates when names of competitive companies are mentioned in meetings.

Your local policy monitoring software should also be able to constantly monitor for specific names of local governments' programs or initiatives.



Research Entire **Documents**

New initiatives and opportunities beyond the topics you currently track happen all the time. Want to look back and see the discussions that appeared in previous documents? Or see if it's on an upcoming agenda? Make sure this is an option with the software you select.

A best-in-class local policy monitoring software should index entire documents, allowing you to use the tool as a search engine to find matching phrases within any document. It should also let you look up discussions in any of your tracked locations that match any advocacy topics that matter to your organization.
